THE LIMITED PROPORTIONS of this Melbourne bathroom forced interior designer Kate Walker of KWD to think outside the box, in more ways than one, to devise a successful design. "This bathroom is in the original part of the home, so we were very confined with space. It is also a family bathroom so we wanted to make sure we were conscious of functionality and space, and originally planned to incorporate a bath and a shower. Our solution was to create a wet room, positioning the shower in front of the bath. Optically, this offers a great deal of space while, practically, it allows for both a shower and bath in a small area." *What luxury item did you choose for this bathroom regardless of budget?* "Taking the limestone from floor to ceiling.
