














replacing window frames to restoring heritage details and adding suitable, site-specific fixtures and fittings.

When design studio KWD popped up on Tennille's Instagram feed, she was instantly smitten with the firm's use of hard finishes, but Rob was hesitant to engage someone. "He straight up said no, but eventually, and reluctantly, I managed to drag him along to a meeting. Once we engaged KWD, our dreams grew and we asked the firm to design bespoke furniture, too."

For the interior palette, KWD took cues from Tennille and Rob's eight-year-old twin daughters, Olivia and Lucia, introducing their favourite pinks and purples. "Their bedrooms were the start of the colour story so we wove those hues throughout the house in various tones," says interior designer Kate Walker, director of KWD. "Upstairs, these shades are playful and childlike; downstairs they are carried through in a more sophisticated way. We didn't hold back - we saturated spaces head-to-toe with coloured wallpaper, paint and tiles. We committed to it."

Running along the left side of the house is a fern-green guest room followed by a mauve sitting room. Across the hall, a few rooms were combined to form a hotel-like main bedroom suite with an interconnected bedroom, wardrobe and ensuite. While she loves it now, the hummingbird wallpaper had a hesitant Tennille messaging Kate in the middle of the night. "I was really nervous about it but she encouraged us to just run with it, and we're so glad we did – it's very special," says Tennille. "We had lots of male tradies walking through saying how much they loved the delicate, feminine detail."

The last room of the original house - the main bathroom - features more subdued finishes to function as a "palette cleanser", says Kate. ▶

At the end of the hall is a new glass-enclosed study, its orientation allowing whoever is at the desk to keep an eye on the kids in the swimming pool straight ahead. A left turn at the end of the corridor opens into a long, open-plan kitchen/dining/family area. While the extension absorbed most of the backyard and takes up the majority of the block, Tennille and Rob weren't too concerned as there's still a front garden, an oval at one end of the street and a park two doors up.

For the home's more traditional touchpoints, Kate was inspired by London's luxurious Firmdale Hotels, where the interiors by Kit Kemp feature eclectic mixes of patterned textiles and upholstery. In contrast, the kitchen has a more masculine appearance with monochrome finishes and an abundance of New York marble, the only material Tennille and Rob were wedded to. "The hard finishes were specified first, with the owner firmly fixed on featuring New York marble in the kitchen," says Kate. "Functionality was a priority, so generous storage meant a butler's pantry wasn't necessary — especially as they mainly store fresh produce Rob brings home from work."

Perforated-metal pendant lights and steel-framed doors leading to the patio add a touch of the industrial. Behind the meals area is a shared mudroom and powder room featuring a geometric tiled floor in sharp shades of pink.

The new upstairs addition was created especially for Olivia and Lucia, with bedrooms and glossy strawberry-pink tiled ensuites for each. "The colour schemes resonate with our children and every room speaks to us," says Tennille. "This house totally represents our family and there's not a thing I would change."
