Not surprisingly, the results are droolworthy.


From the bespoke double-gated entry off the nature strip right through to the attention to detail on the brass joinery handles. Beechwood is a thoroughly modern example of stylish Australian living.

The home is filled with exquisite custom-made furniture, carefully selected furnishings and is finished in a colour palette that elegantly reflects all that there is to love about the Australian landscape.

> Kate says one of her main goals in designing the interiors of the home was to keep a strong connection with nature, so natural finishes are abundant, as are aged materials which will develop a more mature patina over time.

Kate paid particular attention to maximising the floor space and this involved pushing out some walls to open up the space and improve the connection between indoors and out.
